Purpose:

- ◆ To effect significant student gains in the classrooms with authentic intellectual work
- ◆ To maintain contact with students personally and holding high expectations for them diminishing the likelihood of discipline problems
- ◆ To provide students with limitless possibilities and help them fulfill high expectations
- ◆ To encourage students to persist in meeting challenges

Implementation Considerations:

- 1) How often are you circulating throughout the classroom, monitoring and motivating all students?
- 2) How are students engaged personally in direct communication with eye-contact, varying voice tone, and immediate feedback?
- 3) How is the classroom arranged in a manner that allows for mobility and cooperative group learning?
- 4) How are students' individual strengths noticed, validated, and encouraged?
- 5) What strategies are used to insure active student engagement and risk-taking?
- 6) How is quality work **individually** defined and expected?
- 7) How is higher level work being incorporated in classroom instruction and students made aware of it?
- 8) How are authentic instruction and meaningful assignments with high expectations being provided?

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
